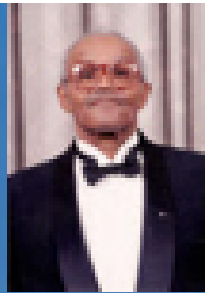

James "Scottie" Scott was born June 7, 1924 to the late Liddia Scott in Donaldson, South Carolina. Scottie known as "June Bug" was raised by his beloved uncle, Rev. George Scott until the age of eight where he was reunited with his mother in Newark, NJ where he continued his education. Scottie served in the US Navy during WWII and after his honorable discharge, he married his longtime sweetheart, Vera Robinson on December 6, 1946.

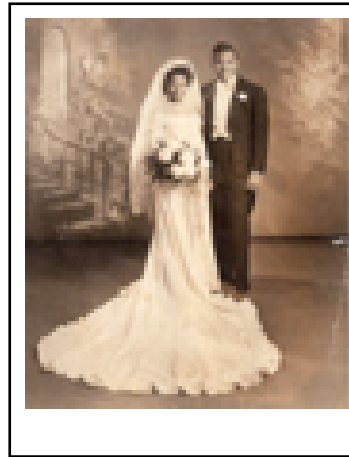

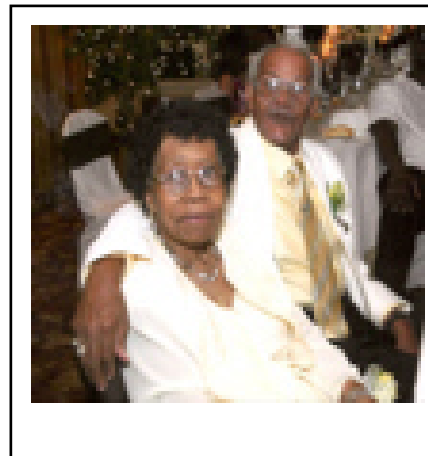
A loving husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather, Mr. James Scott was predeceased by his son, Maurice "Peace".
