

Reflections of Life



John Herbert Franklin was born on October 14, 1932 in Bishopville, South Carolina, the son of Pauline Porter Franklin and Henry Franklin. As a child, his family relocated to Roselle, New Jersey where he was educated in the Roselle Public School system. He graduated from Abraham Clark High School in 1950.

Soon after graduation, "Herb", as he was affectionately known, joined the United States Navy. While on tour of duty, he earned the designation of Chief Petty Officer. A veteran of the Korean War, he received the China Service, American Defense and Good Conduct Medals.

In 1954, John married the love of his life, his childhood sweetheart, Shirley Barbara Burrell. This union was blessed with three children, Gary, Toby and Darren.

Upon his honorable discharge from the service, "Herb" was employed by Metal Textile, now known, as Metex Corporation in Edison, New Jersey. He was proud when his sons joined him at Metex. John would retire as a supervisor after over forty years of dedicated service.

Herb was very concerned about the youth in Roselle. He was a role model for many young boys and they will tell you that through his influence and concern, he made them better men. Because of his concern, he co-founded the Roselle Pop Warner Football League. His daughter, Toby was on the first cheerleading squad and his son, Gary played football. He was also very active in Roselle Recreation.

John was a faithful member of Heard A.M.E. Church in Roselle. He was a former Steward, appointed under the pastorate of the late Rev. Theodore R. Goyins and was a member of the Male Chorus and Emergency Choir. In 2006, the church honored him as "Father of the Year."

Mr. Franklin joined several fraternal organizations. He was a Master Mason – Blue House at Acacia Lodge # 23

– F. & A. M. in Roselle, a Shriner at Golconda Temple #24 in Newark and was a member of both the American Legion Post #499 in Rahway and the George E. Cannon Lodge #858 – I.B.P.O. – Elks of the World in Vauxhall. He was also a member of the Roselle branch of the NAACP.

Herb enjoyed baking and took pride in his pies. He was known in the community for his sweet potato pies. He was also an avid New York Giants Football and Rutgers Football fan. He was a Rutgers season ticket holder for many years and through his friend, John Cummins earned Rutgers Alumni status.

John Herbert Franklin departed this life on Tuesday, May 25, 2010 at Trinitas Regional Medical Center in Elizabeth at the age of 77.

He had been predeceased by his loving wife, Shirley just a month before on April 22, 2010. He was also predeceased by his parents, Pauline and Henry Franklin and two brothers, James and Charles Franklin.

He leaves to cherish fond memories: a daughter, Toby Lauren Carter of Roselle, NJ; two sons, Gary Wayne Franklin of Elizabeth, NJ and Darren Crane Franklin of Linden, NJ; seven grandchildren, Kelli Carter Bell, Brian Franklin, Geoffery Michael Carter, Cory Sean Franklin, Ryan Whitney Franklin, Jamieson M.
