After loosing her husband and our father on July 11, 2007, she remained strong and was still the rock that kept our family together.

As the years rolled on, long before dad died, she was already very ill but, being the strong Christian and believer that she was, time and time again she kept on coming back. We watched our mom suffer with unbearable pain and illness and stayed true to her faith in God.

Many trips were made back and forth from the hospital to home spending short periods being hospitalized. It's amazing, during this episode of her life, there was still a joke from her and words of inspiration.

Her last stay at the hospital as she drifted in and out of consciousness, her words of "God is Good and Lord giveth and He taketh" continuously flowed from her mouth. It was also her wish for us to live in peace and love amongst ourselves.

She had true peace with God and was ready to meet him. Mom wanted her last moments at home as she said constantly. On the 17th of June 2010 after being released from the hospital, Mom died in the comfort of her home and with her kids. She had just a few hours home and it's our belief that she was waiting to get home to spend her last moments with us.

Her smile and deep peace remained on her face as we struggled to accept that the journey with God's Angel that he has blessed our lives with for many years has finally come to an end.
