

Reflections of Life

Sylvia Lorraine (Bell) McEachern Ulmer was born March 24, 1933 in New York City, New York. She was the daughter of the late Arnold and Clarice (Webster) Bell.

At an early age the family relocated to Paterson. It was in Paterson she was educated in the local school system graduating from Eastside High School and later the Sherwood School of Business.

Sylvia began her career with the City of Paterson as a clerk typist in 1952. This was the beginning of many years of service to be given to the City of Paterson. She was elevated to the position of City Clerk in August 1967. In June 1972, she was appointed the prestigious position of Municipal Clerk by Mayor Arthur C. Dwyer. Mrs. Ulmer had the distinction of being the first African American City Clerk in the City of Paterson in the state of New Jersey. She held this position for nineteen years until retiring in 1990. During her forty years of service in Paterson she served under seven mayors and worked closely on various boards and with numerous Aldermen, Presidents and City Council members and Presidents.

Mrs. Ulmer received her certification as a Registered Municipal Clerk of the State of NJ from Rutgers University in 1978.

Following her retirement she did not remain idle she was appointed to fill the unexpired term of 3rd Ward Councilman Martin G. Barnes in 1997. At the end of that term Mrs. Ulmer was elected 3rd Ward Councilwoman in her own right and served as Council President during her last year in office. Sylvia also served as the Human Resource Manager for Concerned Parents for Head Start before retiring January 30, 2009.

Mrs. Ulmer served on many boards and with various organizations. Some of these organizations include Passaic County Vocational and Technical High School Board of Education (1979-1987), member and past president of Passaic County Municipal Clerks Association, past president, Marty Barnes Civic Association and former commissioner Passaic Valley Water Commission. She was presently First Vice President Passaic County African American Women 100 plus.

Her faithfulness and commitment to others would lead her to receive many awards and plaques. They include those received from the Passaic County Board of Chosen Freeholders, Black Men and Women, Paterson Alumnae Chapter Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Office of the Mayor, Rosa Parks School of Fine and Performing Arts, Marty Barnes Civic Association, 1997 Women's History Association, Paterson Public School No.6, United States House of Representatives and the State of New Jersey General Assembly.

Mrs. Ulmer was a faithful member of the Canaan Baptist Church in Paterson. She united in the leadership of the present Pastor Rev. Gadson L. Graham. She served as a member of the Emergency and Mass Choirs and was an organizer and director of the Parent Support Ministry.

She departed this life and entered eternal rest on Saturday, June 19, 2010 at the St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center, Paterson, NJ.

Sylvia is survived by: her son, Brian; daughter, Patricia McEachern; three grandchildren, Reesha, Kimbrina and Jada; one sister, Gloria Rosser; two nephews, Barry Rosser and his wife, Barbara and Brandon Rosser and his wife, Asedua; and a host of other nieces, nephews, cousins, other family members, friends and neighbors.
