

<u>Obituary</u>

Earl (affectionately called "Juice" or "O.J.") was born October 8, 1938, in New York City, the only son of Frank and Eva West Simpson. He departed this life on July 5, 2010 after a brief illness. He received his formal education in the New York City Public School system. Earl later attended the Laurinburg Institute in Laurinburg, NC. He was a member of St. Mark Methodist Church in New York City, NY.

He lived in New York City all his life until settling in New Jersey in 1986. He worked for the United States Postal Service in New York City as a Safe and Lock Mechanic for 34 years, before retiring in 1993. Earl was a sharp shooter in the United States Army and received an honorable discharge. He was also a member of Freestone Lodge #66 in Newark, NJ.

Earl was a quiet and gentle person who loved sports (an avid lover of the Giants, Knicks and the Mets), playing cards, *his* "spirits" and his family. Family and friends were very important in his life. He took pride in his craft.
