Rita was united in holy matrimony to the late Robert L. Malone on April 19, 1946 and although they had no children, they did share many happy years together until he predeceased her in death.

Rita was a member of the Asbury United Methodist Church. She worked in God's vineyard as an active and dedicated member. Rita was truly a Christian woman who always carried the love of God in her heart. She was a very lovely person and a hard worker until she retired.

Rita lived on her own in the Bronx until her health began to fail, moving to The Methodist Church Home for Nursing and Rehabilitation where she was cared for until her death.

Rita leaves to cherish her memory, her niece, Pearl E. Malone of Graham, North Carolina; a great niece, Cynthia Y. Dillehay of Graham, North Carolina; a great nephew, James Weldon Malone (Veronica) of Bronx, New York; and a great-great niece, Jolanda Malone of the Bronx, New York.
