Mother Hazel Lena Corley Brown was born on May 21, 1919 to Bennie and Mary Corley in Screven Co., Georgia, eight miles from the town of Sylvania. Mother was the sixth of thirteen children, seven boys and six girls. She prayed from the mourner's bench and received Christ at the age of eleven years. Since then, Mother remained in the Church working for the Lord until her quiet ascension on August 4, 2010.

Our beloved Mother, Hazel Brown, affectionately called "MA", was an exemplary example of a God-loving, dedicated Christian. She gently admonished her children to always put God first and lived by every word she spoke. "MA" was abundantly blessed with the attributes of patience, kindness and long suffering. Perhaps "MA's" most recognized attribute was that of "peacemaker" because she had a peaceful resolution to problems for all who sought her counsel. "MA" was the matriarch of the family and was the major link that kept it connected.

"MA" attended Coyler/Beach High School. She excelled in all of her subjects and was known as a "math wiz." She later taught school in Savannah. "MA" skillfully helped her great grandchildren solve challenging math problems. Through the years, if there was an event at school in which her children, grandchildren or great grandchildren participated, "MA" always attended the event, right up until her illness in January 2010.

"MA" worked as a Clerk for the NYC Transit Authority for twenty years, while raising five children. Incredibly, she also found time to exercise her entrepreneurial skills as a successful independent salesperson for Copper Craft Guild and Fuller Products.

"MA" was active in her community for over sixty years. At her 90th birthday celebration in 2009, "MA" was presented with a letter of recognition from Mayor Michael Bloomberg and Proclamations from Borough President Scott Stringer and Council person Gale Brewer for her many years of dedicated service. She also served on the Executive Board of the TWU Retirees Association.

Blessed with exceptional culinary skills, sweet aromas were always emanating from "MA's" kitchen. A delicious meal at "MA's" was guaranteed, complimented by a piece of homemade cake, cobbler or pie. "MA" would take crumbs from cakes she collected from birthday celebrations and effortlessly turn them into a wonderful dessert.

"MA" was a faithful member of Southern Baptist Church for over fifty-five years. Her commitment to her church life was unwavering. She was a founding member of the Sunday School PTA and later became President. "MA" was the President of the Floral Ministry for twenty-five years and Vice President of the United Floral Ministry for ten years until her illness in January, 2010.

"MA" loved to travel. The highlight of her life was when she traveled to Jerusalem and was baptized in the River Jordon where our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ was baptized. "MA's" travels also included nine cruises, travel to Hawaii, the Caribbean and many states.

Even as "MA" advanced in years, she remained open to new ideas and maintained a youthful demeanor. In spite of the many challenges she encountered during her ninety-one years of life, "MA" was always optimistic that the outcome of any situation would be favorable.

As a dear friend of Mother, recently said, "when God made Hazel Brown, he threw away the mold!" Amen.
