Obituary

On Friday, September 3, 2010 our hearts were saddened by the loss of our loved one **Elizabeth Haskins**, who departed this life at the Concourse Rehabilitation Center, Bronx, NY.

She was born November 25, 1922 to the late Richard and Mozelle Jones of Chesterfield, VA.

She came to New York at an early age to reside with her aunt and uncle, Frank and Bessie Simmons. Elizabeth was educated in the New York City Public Schools. After graduation, she passed the Civil Service Exam and became gainfully employed as a Steno Secretary. She was assigned to a Lt. Colonel with whom she worked until the end of WWII. Thereafter, Elizabeth was employed for forty-seven years by Commercial Advertising Inc., as a Sales Consultant to thirty-five salesmen of advertising specialties.

In 1956, she became a disciple of Canaan Baptist Church of Christ under the pastorate of the late Rev. Dr. E. M. Moore. Elizabeth has an enviable record of service in the growth of the church and was one of the first female members to serve on the finance committee. She has served in various capacities, chief of which was her election as Treasurer of the Church, in which she served for over forty-three years. Elizabeth served as a member of the Board of Trustees and Secretary to the board. The scope of her service is broad and detailed, but among them are: President of the Friendly Light Club, Secretary of the Church, Golden Jubilee Anniversary, Chairperson of the 9th, Pastoral Anniversary of Dr. and Mrs. Wyatt J. Walker. Elizabeth has had key leadership roles on the Church Policy Committee, the maintenance and administering of the fifty-first year Fund and the Acquisition Fund. In 1978, she was appointed Chairperson of the Christian Family Emphasis Month Observance.

Elizabeth's faith commitment was exemplary in that she completed two Capital Fund Pledge. She exhibited extraordinary dignity, diligence and faithfulness in meeting challenges and in discharging her varying responsibilities with love.

She was a fun-loving person who loved sports, traveling and working for the up building of God's kingdom. Unable to convince her to move back to Virginia, Elizabeth desired to remain in the "Big Apple" until the Lord said well done.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Stanley Haskins, brothers, Leon Jones and Bernard Jones, sisters, Lugertha Jones, Blanche Jones, Ruth Crawley and Dorothy Robinson.

She leaves to mourn her loss: one loving brother, James R. Jones (Sandston, VA) and her beloved and devoted sister, Mildred J. Temple (Chesterfield, VA), a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
