<u>Obituary</u>

Lillian Alberta Robinson was born in Whites Chapel, Oklahoma to Eldora Hammonds and Samuel Kelly Brackeen on November 4, 1929. She was the oldest of five children.

After her mother passed, she and her brothers and sister lived with their father's mother. Subsequently, after her father passed, and at the request of her grandmother, she and her sister traveled to New York City to live with her father's brother and his wife.

Lillian attended Wadleigh High School, graduating with honors even after initially being told she couldn't make the grade. This was the earliest indication of what Lillian was made of since she wouldn't accept being told she couldn't succeed. Instead, she went about proving that those who said that about her were very wrong. She had always been a strong believer in education and not only received a B.A. in Business Management but went on to Fordham University where she received her Masters Degree in Adult Education.

In May, 1945, Lillian joined the Abyssinian Baptist Church. Shortly thereafter, she joined the Young Peoples Choir where she met Bill Robinson. They were married in the summer of 1948. This union produced two daughters, Wylene Yvette and Lois Kelly. After her husband's death in 1969, she devoted her time to her children.

Lillian worked for Grey Advertising, Inc. in the Accounting Department until she retired after thirty-two years. It would seem natural that she be a part of the Abyssinian Baptist Church Federal Credit Union where she brought her vast experience resulting in her being nicknamed "Miss Perfectionist," always insisting that things be just right. She was also a member of the Scholarship Committee, the ACP Memorial Auxiliary and the Missionary Society. She received numerous awards and to her children's surprise, was a New York City Auxiliary Police Officer.

Lillian had many friends and was a friend to many. Although small in stature and quiet, everyone would know when she was serious about something.

She is survived by: her two daughters, Wylene and Kelly; granddaughter, Uhura; brother, Charles Brackeen; sister-in-law; aunts and countless nieces, nephews and cousins.
