

<u>Obituary</u>

Baldwin Bancroft Brown, son of the late Samuel and Marion (Leoline) Brown, was born September 21, 1940 in Lucea, Hanover, Jamaica, West Indies. Baldwin attended St. Simon All-age School and later attended Rusea's High School in Jamaica. He worked at the courts office in Jamaica upon graduating high school, then later took over the family's farm, which he operated for many years. Baldwin migrated to the United States in 1994. He worked at the Chubb's Institute for approximately 10 years. Later, Baldwin attended and graduated from Lincoln Technical Institute with certification in heating and refrigeration and then went on to major in Accounting at Kean University, Union, New Jersey.

He was affectionately called "BB" by family and friends. BB represented youth, agility and a playful nature. He was very gregarious, yet withdrawn at times, displaying a timid disposition. Baldwin enjoyed his youth. He would often tell vivid accounts of stories and experiences that he had with Milton Clark, Canute Grant, Chucky, Owen McIntosh (Mitch), Jocelyn and others. He was unique in many ways. He enjoyed life the way he could. Baldwin loved humor. He liked to tell jokes and watch comedy movies.

Baldwin Brown was very talented as well. In his earlier years, he excelled in academics and athletics. He played football (soccer), cricket, track and long jump. He was also an avid reader and would read a wide range of books and newspapers, including many of Shakespeare's writings. In fact, some of his passionate interests were in law, accounting, and politics. Although he did not pursue a career in these fields, he would always be ready to be engaged in intense legal and political discussions, frequently reciting quotes of famous Latin phrases, one of which was, 'Labor Omnia Vincit' (labor conquers all).

Baldwin was very particular about his appearance and so he dressed very well. People have said he was a very fine man and was appealing to many. Besides his appearance, he was known for his brilliance, wit and wide knowledge in different subject areas. His impeccable memory allowed him to recall lengthy reading passages, poetry, quotes and mathematical operations. He had an extraordinary vocabulary, which he emphasized in his conversations. Among his pastimes, he would enjoy a good game of dominoes and cricket.

Baldwin Brown will be missed by many. He is survived by his wife, Millicent; daughters, Nadeen, Shari, Ouida and Lisa; sons, Clive, Kevin, Anthony, Kirk Brown and Ezroy Adams; eight grandchildren; brother, Joel Spence; nieces, nephews, other relatives and a host of friends.
