Whenever his mother was not home you could find Ashton in the kitchen cooking dinner and grating cassava to bake bammies. Because of these good deeds, Ashton was widely known as "mama's pet". Even though Ashton was not a climber, one day when his mother wanted a breadfruit, he climbed the tree to get her one. When he reached the height high in the tree and could not see his mother nor she him, his mother called out to him "come down mi son".

As the years passed, Ashton met and fell in love with Theresa Wright. He migrated to England in 1960. After sending for his Ter (as Theresa was affectionately called), they exchanged marriage vows in July 1964. Out of this union, they produced four children, Howard (Wayne), Anthony, Wendy and Raynord. After a while, life in England began to get hard for Ashton, so in 1981 he migrated to America and lived in New York. While living in New York he met his companion, Betty Beauford. Betty was a tower of strength for Ashton in sickness and health. Ashton and Betty remained life companions until his passing.

Ashton was employed at 1199 Plaza as a maintenance engineer for seventeen years eventually due to his failing health, he retired in 1997.

Although, he lived in New York, Ashton would always visit his homeland of Jamaica during the Christmas Holidays. Ashton made it a priority to give his family members all a gift whenever he visited.

In addition to his companion, Betty, Ashton could always depend on his nephew, Errol for support. Errol was available for doctors appointments, running errands or just as a source of company when Ashton was home.

Ashton's favorite passtime was watching television. If Ashton was in the house, the television was on. Some of Ashton's favorite movies were Sister Act, Coming To America, Lean On Me and Diary of a Mad Black Woman. Ashton could watch these shows over and over again until those in the house with him got irritated but that didn't matter to Ashton. Ashton was always channel surfing for these shows.

On Friday, September 17, 2010 at 5:21 p.m., as his nephew, Herman watched with love, God called his son, Ashton home.
