Reflections of Life

Tyrone Vernon Carter, Sr. was born to the late William and Arie Carter on January 8th 1945 in Brooklyn, NY. He was the ninth of ten children. He attended the public schools of New York City, including Thomas Jefferson High School, where he enjoyed working in the machine shop.

He learned his good work ethics from his father, who was an entrepreneur. Having a strong relationship with his mother, he looked to her for spiritual guidance and teaching. Their Sunday bible lessons were something he held dear to his heart. These lessons helped guide him into salvation

Tyrone held various jobs. He worked at P. Lorillard Manufacturing Company, The United States Post Office and Gotham Trucking Company, where he held a position until he became disabled.

As a child, Tyrone was introduced to the Lord at Holy Trinity Church of God in Christ, Brooklyn NY, where the late Bishop Frank E. Cook was the Pastor. He was a Sunday School student, a member of the Sunshine Band and the Children's Choir. He also served in the maintenance and upkeep of the church.

He later became a member of Greater Emmanuel Temple, Bronx, NY, where the pastor was the Late, Bishop Allen McDaniel, where he gave his heart to the Lord. The Pastors illness led him to send his congregation to the headquarters church, Salvation and Deliverance Church, Harlem NY, under the leadership of the late Apostle William Brown. He was filled with God's Precious Holy Ghost in January of 2008. After the passing of the Apostle, he continued to serve under Pastor Jerome King.

Tyrone was an avid reader. He loved Bible history and American history. He loved to watch war movies and play chess. He taught his children, and his nieces and nephews to play.

He was united in marriage to Doreen (Danna) Hickson on August 30th 1997. He was the father of five children. He was a loving and devoted Husband, a caring Father, Grandfather and Great Grandfather.

He was loved by many. He attracted children where ever he went and always had encouraging words to say. He helped to raise several, Darrell, Jeffrey, Okenya, Moussa and Aboubacar, just to name a few.

Tyrone was jovial. He always had a sweet smile on his face and would enjoy conversing with anyone he came in contact with. He was a lover of life, but most of all he loved the Lord. He was not a complainer as he fervently praised God through his pain. He would sing with a loud voice, "I Need You Now" and "I Love Jesus And He Loves Me."

On Sunday, September 26, 2010, Tyrone Vernon Carter entered into rest. Rest from labor, from sickness, from disappointment, pain and all else. He never gave up, but rather, gave in, knowing that "To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord."

Tyrone was predeceased by his parents and two brothers, Howard and Irving.
