## Reflections of Life

Marcia Duhart enjoyed a full life. She left an outstanding record of activities and promotion of her ideals through hard work, leadership, entrepreneurialism and volunteerism. In transiting from corporate life to retirement, she re-invented herself with themes, focusing on enrichment and the enabling of seniors. When now involved in service to others, she traveled extensively in Asia, Europe, the Caribbean, South America, Middle East/Africa, the Mediterranean and throughout the United States both continental and Alaska and Hawaii.

She was born September 12, 1943 in Hackensack, NJ to Robert M. White and Janet Carter White both preceding her in death.

She was raised in the church. Mt. Ararat Baptist Church was across the street from the family home in Rutherford, NJ. She was witness to service through the church via her great grandfather (Charles Reynolds, Sr.), her grandfather (James Carter, Sr.) and her uncle, (James Carter, Jr.), who all served terms as Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the church; and through her great aunt, (Myrtle Tenbrooke), who was Superintendent of the Sunday School. They have preceded her in death. She spoke fondly of the continued family service to Mt. Ararat Baptist Church through her cousin, Carter L. Carter, who is currently the Chairman of the Trustee Board.

She married George Duhart of Clifton, NJ in 1966 at Mt. Ararat Baptist Church. Through this union one child was born, Kelly Simone.

Marcia received her education in the Rutherford School system, graduating from Rutherford High School in 1962.

She graduated from Rutgers University College-Newark in 1982 with a Bachelor of Science Degree (major: Business Administration; minor Economics). This was a herculean task because she was working full-time; raising her daughter and attending college at night over a twelve year period.

In 1977, she was first employed by Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith in the Newark, NJ office as an administrative assistant. After passing the Series 7-General Securities Representative Exam, she moved to the Corporate Bond Trading Floor in New York as a Registered Administrative Assistant. The Series 7 exam is an exam that all stockbrokers have to pass before being licensed by the National Association of Securities Dealers (NASD). Some brokers boast that their Series 7 exam is harder to pass than the bar exam in some states.

In 1988, she transitioned to a PRISM Corporate Trainer at Merrill Lynch. Later she progressed to the PRISM Help Desk Support as an analyst and then to a Quality Assurance Analyst position. In 1999, after twenty-two years of successful employment at Merrill Lynch, she retired Assistant Vice President of Corporate Training. She highlighted her career at Merrill Lynch with a style of spirituality, wisdom, helpfulness, friendship and freedom.

As an aside, Merrill Lynch, in a way was the family business. Her mother, Janet White, worked for Merrill Lynch for over thirty years. Her cousin, Carter L. Carter and her daughter, Kelly Duhart both worked for Merrill Lynch when they were fresh out of college. Her brother, Robert White received a Merrill Lynch (Winthrop) Scholarship.

Marcia's computer skills did not lay dormant in retirement. In 1999, she founded CyberSeniors Services in Mercer County, NJ at Rossmoor the oldest adult community in NJ. She had broad expertise in computers, including Microsoft Suite Programs, Word, Excel, Power Point, Publisher and Outlook, as well as, an exemplary ability to teach what she knew to others, particularly, seniors with disabilities. Her entrepreneurship, creativity and energy opened a 21st century world of social networking to these seniors, who may not have gained these skills if not for Marcia.

A special retirement section of the March 2, 2010 New York Times (Steven Greenhouse, The job you make. Older workers mine their skills and connections to go their own way, F1, F8) featured Marcia's words and image, recognizing her talent for leading seniors on the path to computer literacy.

Marcia Duhart figured that out on her own. During her final years at Merrill Lynch, where she trained people to use computers, she devoted several days off to testing her idea of teaching computer skills to the elderly. When she taught a few classes at East Windor Senior Center in New Jersey, people flooded in.

"My business spread by word of mouth," she said, adding that some days demand was so great that she left home at 9 a.m. and returned at 7 p.m."

"I've had students up to 90," she said "I'm 67 now, and I have a lot of energy to do this because I do what I love. I love teaching people."

Marcia Duhart is survived by: her daughter, Kelly Duhart of Hillsborough, NJ; her brother, Robert M. White, Jr., MD, FACP of Silver Spring, MD (referred to by her and her friends as "Brother" and by Kelly as "Uncle Brother"). Also she is survived by her aunt, Dolores Carter of Nutley, NJ; her cousins, Lorraine Randolph of Kansas City, MO, Carter L. Carter of Irvington, NJ, April Carter of Nutley, NJ and Destiny and Dante Carter of Nutley, NJ. There are a host of other family, friends, bridge players, fellow travelers and computer-literate seniors who she leaves behind.

As a final note, she did not have a long illness. In answering the call from a neighbor who had fallen and needed help, Marcia Duhart was stricken and did not recover. Her last act on this earth was in service to another on October 22, 2010.
