Obituary

The Book of Life for **Mr. Randolph L. Montgomery** closed on Saturday at 8:05 a.m., October 23, 2010, at his home in New York City.

Randolph Montgomery, son of the late Henry Montgomery and Mary Pringle Montgomery, was born in Vidalia, Toombs County, Georgia on May 23, 1916. He was preceded in death by his four brothers and three sisters.

He received his elementary and high school training at the Public Schools in Vidalia, Toombs County, Georgia.

At an early age Randolph was baptized at The First African Baptist Church Of Vidalia, Georgia.

Randolph was the youngest son of seven children in a close knit family. After high school graduation he decided to move to Miami, Florida. While in Miami he worked as a Tailor after receiving his formal training. He then moved to Harrisburg, PA to be near his older brothers. He lived there for several years before moving to New York City in 1950. Once in NYC he became employed by the US Postal Service. He retired from the Postal Service in 1982 after thirty years of service.

He could always be found helping and providing for those in need. He loved his family and always wanted to see the family unit together. His strength served as a example to the younger members of the family to stay close and love each other. He had a good memory and loved telling family tales whenever they gathered.

In 1961, he was united in marriage to the late Elma Lee Jones. To this union two children were born.

He was a member of the Linesman Fishing Club for many years. He was also a member of the American Postal Workers Union. Randolph loved to fish and sit in front of the building with his friends.

To hold in memory his love and devotion there remains: two loving daughters, Jacquelynn M. Cowan (Vincent) and Angela L. Montgomery; one granddaughter, Latesha Rutland; one grandson, Steve Brown, Jr.; one great granddaughter, Lanese Danis; three nieces, two nephews, cousins; and a host of other relatives and friends.
