Obituary

Louis Allen was born on May 8, 1925 to the late Elizabeth Allen and Ernest Evans in Greenville, SC. He departed this life on December 3, 2010 at the St. Mary's Nursing Home in Orange, NJ.

Louis attended elementary school in South Carolina. In 1943 at the age of eighteen he joined the Navy and served in World War II. In 1946, he was discharged and on his G.I. bill he attended the Rosshon Institute of Photography in Hartford, Connecticut. While in Connecticut, he met the love of his life, Mattie Crooms. They were joined in holy matrimony in 1949 and to this union three children were born, Janie McIntosh, Louis Allen, II and Anthony Allen.

Louis joined the Airforce in 1952 and served in the Korean War as an Airial photographer. In July 1956 he was honorably discharged and returned home to his family.

Louis worked as a photographer at the Al Henderson studios for a short period of time until the time of his giant leap into entrepreneurship when he opened and managed his own photography studio (Glamour Studios). Glamour Studios was contracted by the Newark Public School systems to take school and graduation pictures. He loved his work and raised his children in the business. Louis was a businessman in his own rights. He ran his business until illness no longer permitted.

Later in life Louis found and received Jesus as his Lord and Savior. He joined the St. James AME Church in the city of Newark were he attended faithfully until his health would no longer allowed him.

Louis leaves to cherish his memories: his devoted wife of sixty-one years, Mattie Allen; daughter, Janie McIntosh; sons, Louis Allen II (Tracey), Anthony Allen (Roxanne) and Isaac Reynolds (Crystal); six grandchildren, Darnella Allen-Grey (Winston), Richard McIntosh II (Candace), Akira Brooks-Dasnell (Keenan), Nafeesha Allen and Ameer Allen (aka Hannibal); nine great grandchildren; ten great-great grandchildren; and a host of other relatives and friends.

Louis was preceded in death by his mother, Elizabeth, his father, Ernest, son-inlaw, Richard and his granddaughter, Doris.
