

Obituary

Robert "Bobby" Lee Norman-Fisher was born on January 20, 1931 in Baltimore, Maryland from the union of Susie Satterfield and James Clash. Bobby attended schools in Cambridge, Maryland. In July, 1947 Bobby became a member of the United States Army and served in the Korean War for which he received a Korean Service Medal and three Bronze Stars.

Upon his honorable discharge from the army, Bobby lived in Harlem, New York where he met and married Priscilla Brown October 13, 1956, and they relocated to the Bronx, New York. He became a member of the Black Falcons Club and worked as a truck driver until 1971, after which he moved on to Security work. He later met Margurite Graham and they were married January 5, 1977. Bobby became a member of the Masons in 1979. Upon retirement he moved to Rock Hill, South Carolina and became a member of Boyd Hill Baptist Church.

Bobby returned to New York in November 2010 after an illness where he spent his remaining days with his family. He passed away on December 9, 2010, at Kateri Residence, New York, NY.

Preceding Bobby in death were his wife, Margurite, his parents, and his sister, Bertha Norman.
