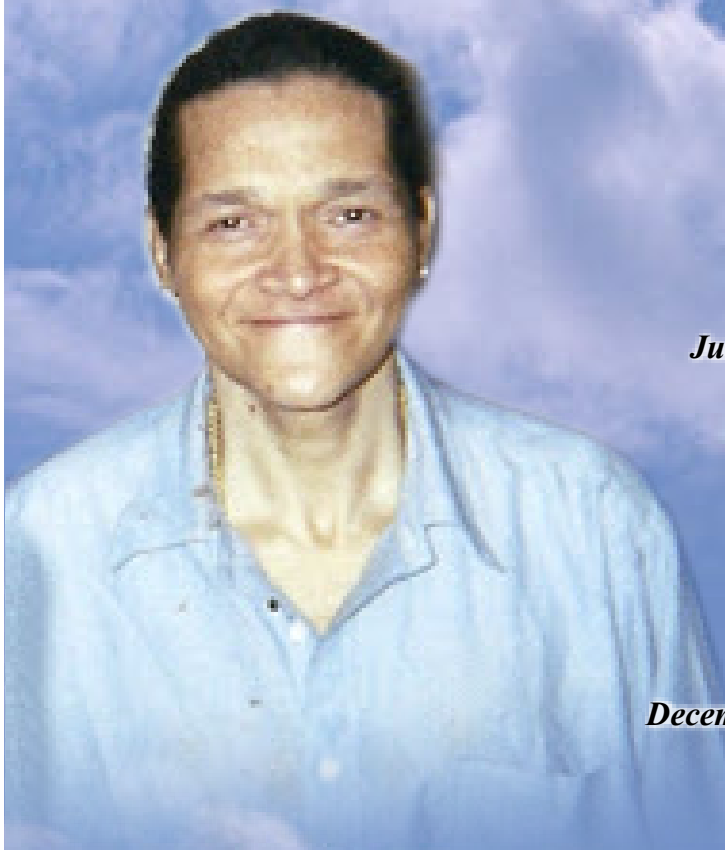

Obituary

Ramon Keith Monroe was born July 20, 1953 at Women's Hospital in New York City. He was the fourth son born to the late Richard S. and Margaret Daniels Monroe. He was baptized a Roman Catholic at St. Aloysius Church on 132nd Street in Harlem, New York. He departed this life on December 26, 2010 at the age of fifty-seven years, five months and six days.

Ramon received his elementary education at P.S. 119 and Frederick Douglas Junior High School. He attended The High School of Commerce, later known as Brandeis HS. After leaving high school, he entered the U.S. Army on September 25, 1970 and was discharged January 21, 1974. Ramon later attended culinary school to become a chef. Upon graduating culinary school, he became employed with the City of New York as a chef for the men's shelter at 8 East 3rd Street. He was employed for ten years before becoming disabled.

Ramon is survived by four brothers, Richard, Ronald, Robert and Reginald of New York City; one sister-in-law, Thelma Monroe (Richard); four aunts, Margaret Monroe of New York City, Sue Jenkins of Bronx, New York, Dorothy Sheff of Amelia, Virginia and Francis Booker of Petersburg, Virginia; one uncle, Wilkes Monroe of Amelia, Virginia; one niece, Margaret Monroe Woods, NYC; one nephew, Troy Malloy, NYC; one great-nephew, Joseph Richard Woods and one great-niece, Stefanie-Grace Woods; along with a host of cousins, other relatives and friends.
