# <u>Obituary</u>

**Cleo Nowell** was born on August 17, 1904 in Barbados, West Indies. She was the daughter of Josephus Beresford Nowell and Christine Marshall Nowell and the youngest of two children.

She was educated in Barbados where she received her highest level of education.

She came to the United States in 1922 and went to live with her aunt, Clara Benskin and her family.

She became a faithful member of the Refuge Church of Christ of under the leadership of pastor and founder Bishop R C Lawson. It was there that she met and married her husband, Joseph Benjamin Chavis on August 18, 1939. It was a fifty-four year union. To this marriage was born a son, Richard Nowell Chavis in 1940.
