Obituary

Fred Douglas Thomas, was born on November 16, 1945 in Bishopville, South Carolina, son of Alice Champagne Thomas and the Late Eugene Thomas, Sr. He lived in Brooklyn, New York before moving to Elizabeth, New Jersey fifty years ago.

He was a United States Army Veteran of the Vietnam War.
