Gerald was later also employed by Pabst Blue Ribbon Company. He was a gifted individual in many areas including possessing a brilliant mathematical mind and a very talented pianist. Gerald had a love of life and in his youth, he was a member of the "Dominating Romeos" a skating team at

Twin City in Elizabeth, NJ. His booming baritone was loving to adults and sometimes frightening to children.

Having grown up in the church, Gerald received Christ as his Savior during his illness. Thanking God for salvation, his eternal resting place with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is secure.

Gerald was predeceased by one brother, Ralph "Mose" Graham and one sister, Katherine, "Cat" Oliver.
