

<u>Reflections of Life</u>

Eugene McLean "Mackie" Smith, Sr. was called home after a long bout with illness on February 5, 2011. He was born on October 16, 1942 on the British Isle of Nevis in the West Indies, the oldest son of Dorothy Adina Powell and Arthur Melbourne Smith. In 1952, he emigrated with his family from Nevis to America. He settled in the city of New Haven, Connecticut where he grew up and attended Hill House High School. It was there that he developed his passion for football and excelled.

After graduating from Hill House High School in 1963, he went on to attend Virginia State University on a football scholarship and he graduated with a degree in Economics in 1967. Shortly after graduating from Virginia State University, he moved to Philadelphia, PA where he met and married Sharon Hood in 1969. In 1971, he moved his budding family to East Orange, NJ and built a life for them. It was there that he put his love of football into action by coaching and mentoring in East Orange's Pop Warner Football League; he assisted in coaching, motivating and mentoring the Cougars, Eagles, and Panthers teams. Later, he went on to coach at Essex Catholic High School (1988-97) and Immaculate Conception High School (1998-99).

In 1978, he took on a new venture and established himself as a successful; selfemployed insurance broker and notary public. Aside from working hard, he loved to play. His favorite hangout spot was Dunkin Donuts. If not at work or on the football field, you could often find him there where he was surrounded by friends, good coffee, and the local talk of the area.

Among the many that remain to celebrate his life are: his ex-wife and dear friend Sharon; his beloved children, Camella, Eugene, Jr., Misha and Markeda; two grandchildren, Isaiah and Jabari; his sisters Brenda and Dorothy; and two brothers, Glendale and Arthur.
