Adrian (Billy) Blackman was born on July 20, 1963, in Jamaica, Queens, New York to the late Alphonso (Micky) Blackman and Lillian Smith Blackman. He attended schools in Queens and Brooklyn, NY.

Billy joined the US Army in 1988, where he served his country for nine years and was a veteran of Desert Storm. While stationed in Germany, he met his wife, Ms. Jerry Lynette. From that union, a son was born, Rashawn Jamel Blackman. Billy received an honorable discharge from the US Army in 1999.

After returning home from the war, Billy worked as a correction officer for the Georgia Correctional Facility for Children and later became a professional tractor trailer driver, which enabled him to travel all over the country. Billy would often take Rashawn with him on the tractor trailer during the summer breaks.

After working several years as a driver, Billy was forced to retire, due to extenuating medical conditions.

Billy was a dedicated and devoted father. Even though he was critically ill, he refused to leave Georgia because he wanted to remain close to his son.
