

<u>Reflections of Life</u>

**Cleveland L. Francis** affectionately known as "Beno" was born on August 28, 1942 in Manchester, Jamaica West Indies to the late George Francis and Marion Butler. He obtained his education at Shortwood Secondary School and University Extra-Mutual Center, where he studied political science, Kingston, Jamaica, W.I.

After graduating he was employed to Masterton Welding Company, Kingston, Jamaica W.I. for over twenty years. In 1968 he met his childhood sweet heart, Francine "Beryl", they were married in 1980, two children were born from this union, Robert and Randy.

He migrated to the USA in the early eighties and was employed by several welding companies, but settled down with "VINCENT IPPOLOTTO SANITATION COMPANY", for over ten years. From 1998 he went independent and operated a successful business named "FRANCIS BURNING & WELDING COMPANY, SPECIALIZING IN SANITATION & HEAVY DUTY EQUIPMENT" until his time of death.

Cleveland's friends recalled the day he named himself "Beno". It happened during one of their many Saturday afternoon cricket games when he scored an inning and he shouted "I am RICHIE BENO". "RICHIE BENAUGH" was distinguished Australian Cricketer, whom Cleveland admired. From that day on he became known as "BENO" and carried himself like the true champion he was. He had many athletic interests, including cycling from 1962 - 1965 he won numerous championships and awards at the Jamaica National Stadium. He was an ardent supporter to the Shortwood Major League United Team of the Kingston & St. Andrew Football Association. He was a life long enthusiast. Also, lover of Thoroughbread Racing from Cayman's Park, Kingston, Jamaica W.I. and the Meadowlands Race Track, where he would socialize with his friends.

Beno wore many hats due to his mature responsible and caring nature. He was a big brother and father to a large extended family, giving advice and re-directed many wayward young men and women in his community. He was a wealth of knowledge and information, which he was willing to share with any and everyone.

His wife, children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews were the special source of his joy and they miss the sound of his voice and his concern for their well-being.

Cleveland is survived by: his wife, Francine "Beryl"; sons, Robert and Randy; grandchildren, Maurice and Warren; his only sibling, Olive; nieces, Dawn and Sharon; nephews, Colin, Dave and Dion; daughter-in-law, Nicole; sisters-in-law, Pewee, Joy and Yvonne; brother-in-law, Gordon; special friend, Patsy Nelson; and a host of cousins, numerous friends and his dog, "TUFFY".
