He moved to Bayonne, New Jersey at an early age and joined the Friendship Baptist Church. He graduated from Bayonne Technical High School where he played basketball and ran track. He was given the name "Flash."

He married his High School sweetheart, Janie Cawthon. In this union, three sons were born: William Jr. (Patsy), Gary (Rosalind) and Mark Anderson (Yvette). He has eight grandchildren, Matthew (Amber), Maria, Melody, Christina, Douglass, Courtney, Diamond and Eugene; and twin great-grandchildren; Jacob and Joseph with another one on the way.

"Bill," was known by his friends, had served in the United States Army Air Force during World War II as a Technical Sergeant. He was honorably discharged.

Bill worked for the US Department of Defense in Springfield, New Jersey for 37 years.

Bill joined the First Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor G. George Abernathy. He was a faithful member of the First Baptist Church serving as the President of the Men's Club for many years. He was a Cub Scout and Boy Scout Leader for many years in the City of Linden.
