Obituary

After being retired for eight years, Calvin became restless. He found work at the New York Division of Human Rights. There he drove three different commissioners around the state for six years. He would boast that he never drove a commissioner whom he didn't learn from.

Calvin went home in peace on March 2, 2011. He leaves to cherish with love and wonderful memories: his wife, Audrey Parris-Harrison of Bronx, NY; children, Julius C. Harrison, Jr. (Elizabeth) of Bronx, NY, Jeffery A.
