

Reflections of Life

Wilbur Lee Roseboro was born on January 18, 1948 to Ethel Lee (Roseboro) Jackson and the late Robert McLendon. Wilbur grew up with the nick name "Pee Wee" and later on in life his daughter, Erica nicknamed him "Serge". He was baptized at an early age and his life revolved around the church. Wilbur was a member of Heavenly Vision Baptist Church of East Orange, NJ. He enjoyed helping members of the church with various activities.

Wilbur enjoyed promoting education and fixing old computers and donating them to his community. He was educated in the Whiteville, NC Public School system where he obtained his high school diploma. Wilbur relocated to Paterson, NJ and he went to enlist in the United States Army and served a year in the Korean War. After his tour in the Armed Services he continued to serve his country for more than twenty years by joining the New Jersey National Guard Reserve where he obtained the rank of 1st Sergeant.

Wilbur was a vigorous hard worker that started his career at Westwood, and continued his career at First Fidelity Bank, NJ Performing Arts Center and ended at the County of Essex where his untimely death occurred.

Wilbur met "Emilee" the love of his life in 1981 and married her in 1982. From this union came Jillian (Kinnery) Brown, Erica and Heather.

After a brief illness Wilbur was called home on Saturday, March 5, 2011. He was predeceased by his father, Robert McLendon and his stepfather, Will Jackson, Jr., brothers, Anthony and Moses Jackson.
