The life of **Bennett Harold Pitts** began on August 19, 1967 in Hackensack, New Jersey.


Harold was the eldest son of Robert Pitts Jr. and Janice Pitts. He began his education in the Paterson, New Jersey School system where he also attended Passaic County Community College. Harold joined the United States Navy in 1986. He was a Religious Petty Officer and Radioman. Seaman Bennett Harold Pitts received extended training in advanced communications and procedures. He was discharged with honors from the United States Navy in 1990.

Harold was well known for his involvement in the church. At a young age he expressed his love for music and taught himself how to play the piano, guitar, and organ by ear. During his early years he was a member and organist for Christ Temple Baptist Church. He also was a member and organist for Holy Tabernacle for many years. During Harold's time at Deliverance, he responded to the Call of God on his life to the gospel ministry. He was licensed, and ordained, by Apostle Walter L. Scott. His love for Christ was strong and he enjoyed expressing his love as a musician for these churches as well as Cannan Baptist Church and various other churches in the New Jersey and New York area, including Victory Faith Deliverance Center in Brooklyn, New York. In September of 2010 Harold came back to Christ Temple Baptist Church as an organist.

He was preceded in death by his father, Robert Pitts Jr., grandmother, Gertrude McCleod Houston, one uncle, Clyde Pitts, one aunt, Carrie "Daisy" Mae Jacobs, and one cousin, Angela Pitts.

He exchanged this earthly life for eternal life on Thursday, March 17, 2011.
