She extended her education to include courses taken at Essex County College and Rutgers Labor Education Center and Montclair State College.

Elois was united in marriage to Benjamin L. Jones and to this union one child was born, Benjamin Jones, Jr.

Elois served as Vice President of Communications Workers of America (AFL-CIO) for eight years and Chairperson of the Legislative Committee.

Elois departed this life on Thursday, March 24, 2011.
