

The Obituary

On December 6, 1948, eager to arrive, **Pastor Tony B. Rozier**, **Jr.** was born to the late Rev. Tonnie B. Rozier Sr. and Evg. Tenner Rozier in their loving home. Pastor Tony B. Rozier Jr. attended PS 3 Public Elementary School and Junior High 38 in Bronx, NY and later attended Morris High School where he developed a passion for Basketball. His love for Basketball was recognized by his peers as he was picked to play with the Harlem Wizards Basketball team where he was affectionately known as T. Rose! He was born the only boy of 5 beautiful sisters.

Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr. had a love for music and began singing, writing and arranging songs as a young adult. He started two groups of his own comprised of his closest friends. He performed at the Apollo Theater in Harlem NY and was the opening artist for The Jackson Five.

He met the love of his life Dr. Linda A. Rozier whom he later married and together they shared a beautiful family. They later learned that their families have had ties since the 1800's in North Carolina. As a young man his presence was made known, for he was a man of class always well dressed, friendly, and mild mannered. He loved to travel. He loved to cook. His pancakes and stuffing, made from scratch, were the family favorite. He knew his way around the kitchen and inherited the gift of baking to perfection from his father, which he passed along to his oldest son, Tonnie B. Rozier, III, owner of Tonnie's Mini's Bakery in Harlem, NY. If you knew nothing else you knew that Pastor Tony Rozier, Jr. absolutely adored and loved his wife and family. Whenever you saw him, you saw Dr. Linda Rozier standing right by his side. They truly were a couple that people wanted to emulate. He was father to many and it didn't matter who you were, he showed unconditional love to each and every one. He enjoyed spending time with family and friends and made himself available to help anyone in need. He was a very generous man who would give his last (even to strangers).

Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr. was a member of Rozier Temple Church of God in Christ formerly known as Herring Memorial Temple and St. Holmes Church C.O.G.I.C. where he was elevated to Senior Pastor in 2004. His favorite passage of scripture was Psalms 23, and every time he ministered that passage of scripture you would receive a new revelation. He had a Pastor's heart and loved one and all, everyone was special in his eyes whether great or small. He never judged or condemned a soul and all were welcomed to join the church family. Through his ministry he allowed his life experiences to be applied to his teachings to build souls that were lost and let them know that we all have come short of the glory of God. He loved you through your pain and took you in when others turned you away. He was a man of heavenly wisdom and always shared his "golden nuggets" with his congregation and U.C.I.W.O Chaplains. He taught us all how to love one another unconditionally. Even towards the end of his journey, as he laid unable to speak, his light still shined brightly, and drew two of his homecare aids to salvation!

Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr. envisioned a Chaplain Organization that would utilize men and women to touch the hearts and minds of hurting people everywhere.

In September 2002, his vision was birthed, when he, his wife, and his oldest daughter, Linell Wright, founded United Chaplains International Worldwide Outreach Inc. as CEO, and CO/CEO, together, he and his wife worked tirelessly to begin to heal hurting hearts. Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr.'s vision stands on the premise that God is at the center of his work, and provides the basis for the present future growth and development of the organization. He taught the Chaplains that, "not one of us is greater than all of us", and that, "teamwork makes the dream work!" His legacy touched so many lives.

Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr. completed his Chaplain training in New York City and received his Certification in Community Help and Stress Management. He was nominated for the Governor's Volunteer Awards in 2004. He was featured in the November 2004 issue of Positive Community Magazine. He served as a member of the City of Newark Police Chaplains. In June 2004, in recognition of a Proclamation voted for by the Council of the City of Newark, New Jersey, Pastor Rozier, Jr. and Dr. Rozier were individually presented award plaques in recognition of Outstanding Community Service. UCIWO was nominated in January 2005 by the New Jersey State Clergy Alliance as one of the three leading organizations in the State of New Jersey. This acknowledgement was presented at the black-tie Recognition Affair held at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark, New Jersey.

Even though ministry was most important to Pastor Rozier Jr., his love for music remained a pivotal cornerstone in his life and his lifelong dream was to write, arrange and produce his very own musical project. Spending long nights into the wee hours of the morning with Chico Mendoza (Bro. Jay), John from Skylight Studios, Sheria Hammock & Dr. Linda Rozier, he was able to complete his first album release titled, "Praying Time" featuring Sheria Hammock. In May 2009, Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr. stood on the steps of Newark City Hall for the National Day of Prayer to sing "Praying Time". Even though he wasn't feeling well, he was determined not to miss the

opportunity to share the gift of song with the world. He even wanted to get the song to President Barak Obama so that it could be the theme song played for The National Day of Prayer all across the world. He also wrote and produced a song called "I Love You" which was dedicated to Dr. Linda Rozier and that song was the theme for the Valentines Day Wedding Gala of 2009 held at the WISOMM Center, led by CEO, Sis. Fredrica Bey, in Newark, NJ. With his determination and perseverance, many have had the opportunity to enjoy the musical sounds of Pastor Tony B. Rozier Jr. Pastor Tony B. Rozier, Jr. had a major impact on so many lives and his leadership was commended both locally and abroad. In the words of Council President Mildred Crump, "His Christian walk spoke to the character of the man and he always had a smile on his face and a kind word for everyone."



He had many phrases and sayings that he was affectionately known for, like, "Im so sorry my friend", "Come on somebody!" but the one that resounds in all of our hearts today is "I'll See You Soon".

It is so befitting that he went home to be with the Lord on April 1, 2011, one of his favorite days of the year. Because he was such a prankster any day of the year could be considered April Fools day to him. God called His servant home from labor to reward. He leaves to celebrate his life and cherish his loving memory:
