Herbert Murphy, son of the late John Frank and Martha Murphy, was born October 15, 1923 in Hookerton, North Carolina. He was the third oldest of seven siblings. Herbert joined in holy matrimony with Mattie Murphy on May 3, 1952. Together they raised three beautiful daughters and two grandsons.

Herbert entered into the Armed Forces on November 29, 1945. He served in Okinawa, Japan and Germany during World War II. He served in the Army as a Rifleman. During his tour he received a victory medal and an army of occupation medal. Herbert departed his service from the army with an honorable discharge on August 27, 1948. After service Herbert became an active member of the Shelton Chapter of the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Jersey City. Herbert worked as a Crane Operator at Tide Water House for over thirty years. He also was a truck driver for a number of years. Later after retirement he worked part-time as a security guard.
