From his extensive training, he then organized and started a band which was called "The Landlord and Tenants", landing notable gigs in Harlem at Smalls Paradise, The Cotton Club, The Audubon Ballroom and the Lenox Lounge, just to name a few.

Some of his most memorable engagements were being the opening act for music legend, the late great Sam Cooke, and performing with soul legend, King Curtis. Charlie also performed with Roberta Flack and blues legend, B.B. King.

One of the highlights of his band's career was playing at the political reception for New York City's own Mayor, John Lindsay.

Charlie was very loved and adored throughout the Harlem Community as well as in the Bronx where he lived for over forty-fie years.

His love for his children was endless. Charlie was always there for his children and grandchildren and would support them unconditionally. He was a strong believer in family unity and wanting the family to be there for one another. His bond with his siblings, Ola and Ernest was immeasurable and extremely strong and admired.
