When I was young, I would go on my dad's saltwater fishing boat. Sometimes offshore for forty-eight hours. Often I got seasick early on the trip, and nothing — not even pain relief tablets of seasick medicine—could take away the pounding headaches. Every minute on the rocking boat seemed like an hour, and an hour felt like a day. So it is when we are in pain. Pain is the closest thing to slowing down or even stopping time. The readers of Peter's letter must have felt that the persecution against them would never end. How comforting the message from Peter must have been when he reassured them that their suffering was for only a little while in the big picture of God's plan. How encouraging were the words that Christ Himself will restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish them. The same message is also for us. When suffering, especially in service to Christ, seems like an eternity, the Lord grants us the perseverance of Christ to outlast any pain and to consider it a temporary condition in the span of eternity.

1 Peter 5:10 - And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself restore confirm strengthen, and establish you.
