Richard Leroy Laing was born on April 1, 1935 in Tarpon Springs, Florida to the late Lawrence Laing and Elmer Lee Laing. He departed this life on Tuesday morning July 5, 2011, after a lengthy illness.

As a child, his parents moved to Long Island, New York. Richard was educated through the Freeport School system where he participated in numerous sports and graduated from Freeport High School. Shortly after graduating he served in the United States Army and toured Korea.

In 1957, Richard married the late Ernestine Darrell from this union three children were born Linda, Cornell and Tony. Many years later Richard relocated to New Jersey.

Richard worked numerous jobs prior to being employed by General Motors Corporation located in Linden, New Jersey. He retired after thirty-three years and two months on January 1, 2000.

Under the leadership of John Thomas and Connie Woodruff, he was one of the original organizers of the 1966 Chripus Attucks Society Parade, the first Black Parade in the City of Newark, New Jersey, today known as the Black Heritage Parade. For several years, Richard was devoted to sponsoring over forty children in the community on camping trips prior to Former Newark Mayor Kenneth Gibson's administration providing funds. Along with Richard's love for children, he had a heart for helping the needy by volunteering many years of service. Richard and friends organized a Men's Club called The Eight of Us. Together they traveled to different parts of the world and went fishing. The bond between the members continues on today. Richard had a love for classical opera, fishing, historical events and traveling.


Richard was a member of Christian Love Baptist Church in Irvington, New Jersey for several years where he served on the Trustee Ministry, volunteered in the daycare center and aided with the community outreach program devoting hours feeding the needy. In August of 1996, Richard moved his membership to Mount Hermon Missionary Baptist Church then under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Jeremiah Ford. Richard served on the Trustee Ministry, the Usher Ministry, and as President of the Men's Day Ministry. Not only did Richard's walk with the Lord grow through the teachings and blessings he received at Mount Hermon, God blessed him with the friendship of Shirley Thomas Daniel. On February 14, 1998, Richard and Shirley were united in marriage.
