Walter Daniel Wilson was born to Daniel and Elsie Wilson in the small community of Eagle Lake, Mississippi on March 6, 1929. Walter was the second child of a sibship of four. He attended elementary school on Eagle Lake/Vicksburg and was awarded a high school equivalency diploma in Vicksburg.

Feeling restless and wanting to see more of the world, Walter enlisted in the United States Navy at the young age of seventeen. He was among the first to serve on the USS Constellation and could amuse anyone with many stories about the newest and largest air craft carrier of its time. Walter served his country faithfully for twenty-two years and received an honorable discharge in 1970. After making the decision to settle in New Jersey, Walter was employed by the United States Postal Service and remained there for twenty years.

The navy provided Walter with the opportunity to become a "well travelled" man. As such, he visited several places both domestic and abroad; and even though he made New Jersey his new home, Walter always considered Vicksburg his true home. He rarely missed visiting his parents each May and after their deaths, he continued to make periodic visits to Vicksburg checking in on his younger brother, Joe.

Walter was not a man who tended toward joining organizations and did not have a formal church home, nevertheless he reverenced God and was not ashamed to proclaim the goodness of the Lord. He was known to read his Bible, Psalms 23 being one of his favorites, while sitting in his usual place by the front window of his home.

Preceding Walter in death were his parents, Daniel and Elsie, his sister, Evelyn and his brother, Joe. He will be truly missed by all who knew him and leaves to cherish his memory: his sister, Ruby M. Ross of Los Angeles; two nephews, Victor and Steven Ross both of Los Angeles; three nieces, Monica Wilson, of Vicksburg, Roberta Wilson of Jersey City and Gwendolyn Jordan, of Los Angeles; three great nieces; and three great nephews all of Los Angeles.
