<u>Obituary</u>

Deacon Lawrence Bridgeforth, known to many of his friends as "Larry," was born June 27, 1942 to Leroy Bridgeforth and Vanisha Foushee. He was also blessed to have Mr. and Mrs. John Coleman as major influences in his life. Deacon Bridgeforth was a lifelong resident of the City of Newark, New Jersey. Lawrence attended the Newark School and attended Essex County College.

Lawrence began his Christian journey at the Mount Sinai Baptist Church, where he and Mamie grew up. Lawrence served his country as a member of the United States Air Force. Upon his discharge from the Air Force, Lawrence married his childhood sweetheart Mamie Lee White, who he met when he was ten and she was eight years old. From this union, were born three daughters: Leah, NaDeen, and Lawren. Lawrence was a very hardworking man. For fourteen years he worked two jobs, Deer Park Water Company, as a driver, and as an independent distributor for the Star Ledger and the New York Times, covering a large segment of Essex County. Lawrence was the owner of the L.N.L. Grocery Store located on 2nd Street in Newark. He established the F.C.C. Transportation Service as the CEO, fourteen years ago, continuing to employ Newark residents until this day. His motto, which was printed on all of his business cards, was "Riding with the full armor of God around you."

Deacon Bridgeforth loved deep sea fishing and he and Mamie would often go fishing in September when the Blues were running. An avid bowler, Deacon Bridgeforth was a member of the Dragons Bowling Team. Deacon Bridgeforth was a very good and generous friend to many people, including Charlie O and Herman. They were the Three Musketeers. Small in stature, Deacon Bridgeforth was a very elegant dresser. He never believed man should go to church without a suit, tie and of course a hat. He instilled this value within his two grandsons.

A man of courage, when Deacon Bridgeforth was facing a life-threatening illness, he stood upon the scriptures Isaiah 53:5 and Psalm 91. Deacon Bridgeforth received a liver transplant in 1995 and served as a spokesperson for the N.J. Sharing Network

He was recognized for his efforts and community service in this area by the First Baptist Church of Vauxhall and the Honorable former Councilman Ronald Rice, Sr. Deacon Bridgeforth served his community in a leadership role as the District Leader for the 38th District for the West Ward of Newark for twelve years.

Deacon Bridgeforth was ordained as a Deacon under the Pastorship of Bishop Marvin Bradshaw, Sr. in November 1997, at the Faith Christian Center, where he served as a Deacon until his death. Deacon Bridgeforth was a foster parent and grandparent to many children who have all grown up to become successful adults.

It is hard to mention Lawrence without mentioning Mamie, and hard to mention Mamie without mentioning Lawrence. They were like rice and gravy. Although the man of his household and the "king of his castle" he was always supportive of his wife's dreams as she pursued higher education, elected office and the ministry.

Deacon Bridgeforth peacefully went Home to be with the Lord on October 6, 2011, at the Mountainside Hospital in Montclair, NJ. Deacon Bridgeforth was preceded in death by his grandmother, Viola Foushee, mother, Vanisha Foushee-Holly, stepfather, George Holly, father, Leroy Bridgeforth, stepmother, Mattie Bridgeforth, godparents, John and Goldie Coleman, two brothers, James and Ronald Bridgeforth, one sister, Irene Craddock and one sister-in-law, Linda Bridgeforth.

He leaves to cherish his memory: his beloved wife of forty-seven years, Dr. Mamie Bridgeforth; his children, Leah Dade, NaDeen Richardson and her husband, Rev. Terry L. Richardson, Lawren Monroe and her husband, Rev. Darrin Monroe and Ivy Davis and (son) Rev. Gerard Hart; one sister, Mary Ruth; brothers-in-law, Bernard Ruth and Thomas White, sister-in-law, Linda White; his mother-in-law, Lucille White; two aunts, Evelyn Bridgeforth and Irma Hewie; one great aunt, Mable Scott; two uncles, Henry and Morris Foushee.
