Life of Elisabeth Katharine Sattler Anderson

Elisabeth was born January 23, 1922 in Bartenbach, Germany to Peter Sattler and Friedrike Mayer-Sattler. She had an older brother Hermann and a younger sister, Else. They were orphaned at a young age and separated to be reared by other family members within the same town, (however with limited contact with each other). When Elisabeth and her sister graduated high school, they went to work. Her brother graduated high school and joined the military. As time passed, all three siblings started to come together as a family. Elisabeth survived many challenges such as World War II and post war devastation.

Right after the war, she gave birth to her daughter, Dorothy Elisabeth. During those early years after the war, there was a severe

lack of food. Everyone had to barter for basic provisions. Elisabeth spoke of the time she traded a regular wooden kitchen chair for one pound of flour, three potatoes, and a half pound of sugar, that was suppose to last for two weeks or until more provisions became available. Elisabeth knew that she had to do whatever it took to provide a better life for her daughter.

On August 13, 1955, Elisabeth married Joseph Anderson, who was in the United States Army. In September of 1956, Elisabeth and her family arrived in New York City, NY and settled in Newark, NJ. A new life began.

She did not allow her limitations of the English language and American culture to stop her from providing for her family. She was strong willed and determined to excel at any challenge and/or job that came her way.

In 1958, Elisabeth gave birth to her second daughter, Serena Dolores. She provided a good living for her family. She loved to knit, crochet and bake for family and friends. She was a fashionista before her time; she loved to dress. Elisabeth believed that you can look like a million, and not have a million. She spoke her mind; never a loss for words, always direct and to the point.

Elisabeth was a woman of strong courage, character and strength. She was extremely protective of her family. In her younger years in Germany, she would pray to GOD to bless her with a loving family that she could take care of and love, and GOD granted her wish.

Elisabeth gave her life to the Lord in 1971 at Old First Presbyterian Church in Newark, NJ. She re-dedicated her life to the Lord in 1993 at Faith Fellowship World Outreach Ministries in Sayreville, NJ. Elisabeth was predeceased by her parents, Peter and Friedrike Sattler and her brother, Hermann Sattler. She is survived by her one remaining sibling, Else Sattler; her daughters, Dorothy Rivers and Serena Williams; her grandchildren, Ron Rivers, Melissa Richardson, Tiffany Rivers and Craig Jordan; her adopted grandchildren, Dorian Williams and family, Melissa Blount and family and Mishelle Green and family; many loving great grandchildren, one great great grandchild, nieces, nephews and many precious extended family members.
