Celebrating the Life and Legacy of Bishop Doctor Milton Aaron Hobbs

After years of exemplary service, God saw in His divine wisdom to call **Bishop Doctor Milton Aaron Hobbs** from labor to reward on Thursday November 10, 2011.

Early Life

Born Monday, January 14, 1929 in Clinton, North Carolina, **Bishop Hobbs** was the seventh of twelve children born to the late Hosea and Ada Hobbs.

Very early in his life, **Bishop Hobbs** displayed an enormous capacity to both love and serve the Lord Jesus Christ. He often testified how he received the gift of the Holy Ghost when he was just fourteen years old and how the Spirit often moved him to prophesy and lay hands on the sick that they may recover.

In 1952 he was drafted into the United States Army and served with distinction while stationed in Japan. Despite much ridicule and jesting from fellow soldiers and on-lookers, **Bishop Hobbs** remained a “Conscientious Objector” upholding his religious right, maintaining his integrity. **Bishop Hobbs** refused to carry arms for the use of human destruction the entire two years of his military fulfillment. While stationed in Japan, **Bishop Hobbs** also studied at Tokyo University.

Bishop Hobbs returned to civilian life in 1954 and soon met the young lady who would become his love and companion for life, Shirley Ann Walker. After a whirlwind romance, Milton and Shirley were united in holy matrimony in March of 1955. Their life together was filled with laughter, warmth, and service to God’s people. Together they treasured and cared for five wonderful children: Milton B., Yvette, Aaron, Daryl and Shawn.

Early Ministry

In 1959 **Bishop Hobbs** was installed as pastor of Faith Temple Pentecostal Church. During those early years, the Lord established his ministry with many amazing spiritual signs and wonders. People were regularly healed and delivered from countless ailments and diseases. Sickesses and conditions from cancer to blindness were restored to health under his pastorate. In 1967 the Lord moved him, for a season, from Faith Temple Church to establish New Hope Apostolic Church where his ministry and message matured and flourished even greater. By 1975, the two churches merged to become Faith Temple New Hope Church. This unification created a need for expansion, so the church searched and found a new home. In 1982 there was a “Grand March” from the old edifice at 50 North Maple Avenue to the new and present location at 57 Prospect Street.

A Life of Distinction

Within the forty plus years that **Bishop Milton A. Hobbs** pastured God’s people, he amassed scores of honors, accolades, recognitions and awards. On **Bishop’s** 35th Anniversary in 1994, the East Orange City Council passed a Resolution renaming Prospect Street at Carlton (where the church sits) “*Bishop Milton A. Hobbs Plaza.*” **Bishop** attended the New York School of Mechanical Dentistry, Eastern College and Manhattan Bible Institute in New York City. He received an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity from United Theological Seminary. **Bishop** also graduated from the International Apostolic Grace and Truth earning a Master’s in Christian Education and Doctorate of Divinity.

Under **Bishop’s** leadership, the church sponsored radio and television ministries, a Prison Ministry, a Nursing Home Ministry, the FTNH Church Federal Credit Union, the FTNH Christian School, and the FTNH Bible Institute, a division of Aeon Bible College.

In addition, **Bishop Hobbs** served as District Elder in the New Jersey District Council of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the World (PAW); Dean of the New Jersey Branch of the Aeon Bible College; Dean of Faith Temple New Hope Bible Institute and Honorary Dean of the Faith Temple New Hope Christian School.

Bishop Hobbs’s compassionate spirit and altruistic nature made him a friend and confidant of many near and far. He was never too busy to listen, counsel, or console. His genuine sense humor and love of family mark only some of the finer facets of this precious gem. You could never remain downcast or dispirited in his presence for long. **Bishop Hobbs** took Proverbs 17:22a (*AMP-A happy heart is good medicine and a cheerful mind works healing.*) to heart, literally; and lived it every day! He was a true King of Comedy! His love for God’s people compelled him to assist in uplifting, encouraging, and restoring their joy! We are grateful and humbled to have known **Bishop Milton A. Hobbs** in this life and are gladdened to know that he is now where he wanted to be, in HIS presence.

Bishop Hobbs was preceded in death by his parents, Hosea and Ada Hobbs; as well as siblings, Ira, Johnnie, Emma, Junior, Freddie, Robert and Delores.

Bishop Hobbs leaves to cherish his memories and continue his distinguished legacy: his loving and devoted wife, Shirley, of 56 golden years; son, Milton B., Pastor of New Covenant Fellowship of Clark, NJ; his only daughter, Yvette Anderson; sons, Aaron, Pastor of Faith Temple New Hope, East Orange, NJ; Daryl and Dr. Shawn Hobbs; his Godson, Derrick Green, Pastor of Jericho City Without Walls; one son-in-law; Mark, four daughters-in-law; Kathy, Valerie, Dina, and Bieny Hobbs; his mother-in-law, Ethel Bethea and father-in-law Carl Walker; his siblings, Rosa Allen (Gilmore), Alma Hobbs, Carrie Heath, and Franklin (Carolyn) Hobbs; thirteen grandchildren: Nicole Robinson (Darnell), Milton C., Christopher, and Quentin Hobbs; Diamond and Eugene Anderson; Ahmad Morris, Alexa and Amber Hobbs; Donovan and Danyelle Hobbs; Seon (Waylon), Gianni and Dawson Hobbs; six great-grandchildren: Ayanna, Isaiah, Major, Christian, Jaylon, and Nyla; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, friends and church family.


