
Celebration of Life for Homer Jackson

<u>Obituary</u>

Homer Jackson was born to the late Coss and Annie Lou Jackson on August 8, 1919 in Sandersville, Georgia. He was the eighth of nine children.

Homer lost both parents at a very young age, which forced him to grow up fast. After the death of his parents, he moved to Florida with his younger brother, Marion Jackson.

Homer and Marion did not remain in Florida long. They followed the path of many young African American men of that era by migrating north, finding New Jersey to their liking. They settled in Jersey City. There he met Doris E. Aldridge and they were married on March 30, 1957. He was blessed to inherit a stepson, James Roger. Homer and Doris were also blessed with the birth of a daughter, Cynthia Carol on March 31, 1966. Homer retired from the Ronson Company in 1985.

Anyone that spent time with Homer learned that he loved simple pleasures in life: His wife's cooking, especially his favorite, her baked chicken. He enjoyed watching endless hours of Gun Smoke and baseball on TV, and playing the lottery. The most important thing was his family. He brought a warm and peacefulness whenever he was around.
