The Obituary

Earline Hollingsworth was born in Ladson, SC to Rev. George Washington Garvin and Mary Garvin, on July 4, 1913. She was the eleventh of twelve children and she was proud of being born on the 4th of July. She attended school in Ladson until her father died in 1924. A few months later, her brother William arranged for his mother and the six youngest children to come live in NYC. They sailed from Charleston, South Carolina to NY in early 1925. Earline and her siblings were enrolled in the NYC public schools and they joined Salem Methodist Church.

Because she was very smart and a natural leader, her mother would entrust her with the shopping and paying of the family bills. As she got older, she wanted to go with her sisters to the Savoy or Renaissance Ballroom on Sunday afternoon. One Sunday, her younger sister Marie (Maddie) introduced her to her future husband, Burvin Hollingsworth. They were married February 5, 1931 at the Municipal Building. To this union five children were born. Earline and Burvin were happily married until his death in February of 1968. Their sons, Burvin Jr., Ronald and William, preceded her in death.

Earline was very involved in the schools her children attended and served as the PTA President, and was also an officer in the United Parent Teachers Association. The family moved to Queens in June of 1958 and joined Resurrection Lutheran Church. She taught Sunday school and was the Assistant Sunday School superintendent under Carl Lee. She was also a dedicated member of the Altar Guild for many years. She was employed as a School Aide at Andrew Jackson High School until she was called to work for the City of New York, for Housing and later the Agency for Child Development from which she retired in July of 1978.

During her employment with the city, she went back to school, got her G.E.D. and went to Manhattan College and the College of New Rochelle from which she graduated with a B.A. in June of 1974. Her family members were very proud of her determination to get a College degree.

In early 1960's, Earline and Burvin welcomed several foster children into the family. She called them children of the heart and they remain her children to this day. For most of her ninety-eight years, she enjoyed good health until 2009 when she had Osteomyelitis. She slowly began not eating well and virtually stopped eating a few weeks before being taken to the Hospital, from where she went to eternal rest, joining her husband, sons, brothers and sisters in Heaven.

She leaves to mourn: her daughters, Saundra Hollingsworth and Jerilynn Smart; the children of her heart, Deniece Jordan, John Covington and Edward Flournoy; twenty grandchildren (two others preceded her in death); thirty-six great grandchildren and thirteen great grands; one son-in-law, one goddaughter, nieces, nephews, cousins, and her first cousin, Thelma Jenkins, the last of the original Garvin's.
