Obituary

Barbara Anne Delaney has been a member of North Jersey NANBPWC since the 1960's and is a Life Member. Barbara retired as a foreign language educator in the Newark, New Jersey Public Schools. She continues her travel and service to communities in Africa. Over the past ten years, Barbara has made twelve trips to the Motherland - Africa - visiting Senegal, The Gambia, Ghana and Kenya. She has made many friends, personally taking care of families, sending their children to school, and shipping hundreds of boxes to communities in need. Barbara Delaney sponsors a soccer team in The Gambia and in 1996 she was presented with a medal for her international advocacy of soccer which was witnessed by Gambian representatives and United Nations Officials.

Barbara Anne Delaney has received awards from several organizations such as: Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority; NAACP; National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc.; Queen of Sheba Grand Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star; and the National Association of University Women (NAUW). Having been a member of NAUW since 1957 and a Life member, Barbara chairs its initiative on Bone Marrow Education, a health project emphasizing the importance of bone marrow transplants, especially among African Americans.

Born in Newark, New Jersey to the late Ethel Baskerville Delaney of South Hill, Virginia and the late Leroy Delaney of Pleasantville, New Jersey. Barbara Delaney was educated in the Newark Public Schools and is a graduate of South Side High School (Malcolm X Shabazz). She earned a B.S. Degree from Howard University in Washington, D.C.; she was a Distinguished Graduate Fellow at Yeshiva University earning a Master's degree in Education and Psychology; and she earned a second Master's degree in Supervision and Administration from Kean University in Union, New Jersey. Barbara was President of the Future Teachers of America and a member of the prestigious Howard Players at Howard University. Throughout her life, she has remained active in education, the theater and global community affiliations.

She leaves to mourn: five cousins, Ammie Evans, Ida Womble, Lucy Carter, Katherine Bynum and George Brown; three dear friends, Dee Jackson, Aleta Smith, Edna Van Dunk and a host of Coworkers and friends.
