

Life Reflections

Walter William Johnson Jr. was the second of two children born in Bloomfield, New Jersey, to Walter William Johnson Sr. and Bettye Mae Johnson on February 1, 1936. His sister Ethreba went to be with the Lord when she was 13 years old.

He married Rosemarie Chevolleau on July 17, 1971 and from that union two children were born, Lisa Marie Johnson and Walter William Johnson III.

He attended the Public School System of Montclair, New Jersey and graduated, receiving his High School Diploma in 1955.

He attended the Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia where he majored in the Social Sciences and received a Bachelor Arts Degree in Sociology in 1959. Having received a call to the Ministry of Jesus Christ and believing that a workman for Him should be one who need not to be ashamed of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, he entered the Seminary Department of the Virginia Union University where he received the Bachelors of Divinity (B.D. Degree) in 1963. In 1970 he entered Princeton Theological Seminary in Princeton, New Jersey where he received his Masters Degree in Sacred Theology (Th. M. Degree). After receiving the Th. M. degree from Princeton, he continued his work towards a Doctorate in the Psychology Department of Andover Newton Theological School in Newton Centre, Massachusetts, where in 1974 he received his Doctorate of Ministry Degree in Clinical Psychology (D. Min.)

<u>Pastoral Experiences</u>: He pastored two churches in the South, namely, the Union Baptist Church in Petersburgh, Virginia, and Calvary Baptist Church in Christchurch, Virginia. Under his guidance and leadership a new brick church structure was completed in 1965 and was dedicated to the honor and glory of God by the former congregation. In 1968 he was called as pastor to the Second Baptist Church, Roselle, New Jersey where he served until 1987.

Under his leadership he established an emergency food program which distributed canned goods and other non-perishable items to needy people in the community. This emergency food program later rolled over into a Senior Citizens' Luncheon Program which provided a hot meal for seniors in the community 1 Saturday per month. He also instituted a Watch Night fellowship dinner where the congregation of Second Baptist Church would travel to Virginia for joint fellowship services (and they in turn would visit Second Baptist for joint fellowship services). He also licensed 2 members from Second Baptist Church, Rev. Barbara D. Turner and Rev. Dr. Glenn E. Porter Sr. to go forth and preach the gospel.

He leaves behind son, Walter W. Johnson III and daughter, Lisa Marie Johnson and also numerous cousins and friends
