Reverend Robinson was also the owner and proprietor of the House of Robinson & Conwell and later the House of Robinson Funeral Home in Newark.

In his later years, Reverend Robinson loved to fish and spend time on his boats. He was preceded in death by one brother, Walter Stevens and two sisters, Jethra & Lula.
