She accepted Christ as her savior at Cedar Grove Baptist Church, Skipwith, VA.

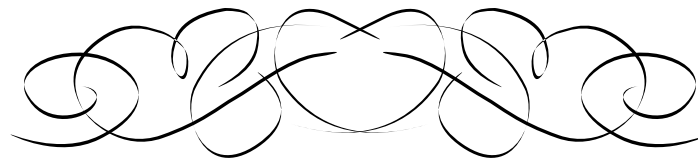
