Fulton Townsel Thomas was born on June 3, 1932 to the late Willie and Etta (Primus) Thomas in Camden, South Carolina. "Townsel" as he was affectionately called, was reared and educated in Ridgewood, NJ. Upon graduating from Ridgewood High School, he enlisted and served honorably in the United States Air Force from 1952-1956.

Townsel was previously employed by Curtis Wright Aeronautics, and PSE&G where he retired as Service Supervisor after thirty-three years of service in the Bergen and Passaic County area. Upon retirement, he enjoyed bowling, family cookouts, and family outings.
