Amongst her many interest and talents, Doris enjoyed nurturing her grandchildren, attending to family matters, singing in the choir, sewing, gardening, traveling and doing household chores. Mom brought life to social family occasions, and did not want to miss the joy of being surrounded by children, grandchildren and the great grandchildren; listening to everybody's woes to which she always had an answer that felt right. Always had a bible story to back it up, and maybe a song to sing to you. Her favorite time of the year was Easter and Christmas. Doris loved life, had a zest with her and would find many things to laugh and smile about. The values in her life were based on faith, integrity and sheer hard work, but above all the love and strength of her family.

She is survived by: six children, three sons-in-law and three daughters-in-law, eighteen grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren; her sister, Maisie, and lots of friends and church family. Although the house was always full, Doris always had the capacity to open her heart and home to children of family, friends and neighbors.

Behind every great family is a great mother, and undoubtedly without her love and support we would not have survived, and often she would say, "God will provide, and he did".
