# <u> Her Life Is Her Testimony</u>

**Clay Ella Kearse Frazier** was born in Orangeburg, South Carolina, on the blessed day of October 25, 1931. She was the youngest daughter of eight children born to the late Mack Kearse, Sr. and Azzie Lee Platts Kearse. She was known to be a lovely and joyful child.

She graduated from Wilkinson High School where she met and married the late Jimmie (Booster) Frazier also of Orangeburg, SC. Together they were devoted and loving parents of six children. They migrated to New York to raise their family.

Clay Ella was educated at Bronx Community College, New York City, where she obtained her degree in nursing. As a registered nurse, she worked for the Veterans Administration Hospital in Bronx New York, primarily in the neurology department. It was there that she cared for the many injured war veterans.

Subsequently, Clay Ella became a member of Healing from Heaven Temple, under the tutelage of Bishop Leo Stallworth, where she was a dedicated and faithful worker. She was ordained as a "Mother of Zion", holding the office of the mother of the church.

In 1986, she was called into full-time ministry where she became the Pastor of Number One Deliverance House of Prayer Church. Mother Frazier taught on the principles of love, salvation and deliverance. Mother Frazier was committed to the apostolic call of "Go ye out into the world and preach the gospel to the lost". She implemented many New York City street outreaches of feeding and clothing the homeless, helping the weary, and leading the unsaved to Jesus Christ. Mother Frazier was an example of a soldier in God's Victorious army. She had a heart of God's love, faith giving, and standing on the word of God. It was because of this that she won many to Christ.

In addition, Mother Frazier was a Diamond Executive Board of Elders member with Morris Cerullo World Evangelism Ministry. She also served on the Board of Governors and Board of Executive Elders. Through her dedication and service with Morris Cerullo, Mother Frazier traveled and ministered in Africa and Jerusalem as well as across the United States.

Mother continued to serve faithfully until God called her home. She didn't believe in retirement from the Lord. Her main life's theme was love, prayer and obedience to God. During her walk of life, she met many prominent people. One is Dr. Joseph Vetere who dedicated his first book "Seven Weeks Of Wellness", to Mother Frazier.
