**Sadie Laverne Durham** was called to her heavenly home on Monday, June 4, 2012. She was born on August 15, 1932 in Passaic, New Jersey to the late Lucinda Landy and Tobb Smith. She was married to the love of her life, Bernard Durham, Sr. on January 21, 1951 until his passing in March 2010.

Sadie was employed by the City of Passaic for over 50 years – for 10 of those years she was the personal assistant to the late Mayor Robert Hare, worked in the Recreation Department, Urban Crisis Center, and in the Senior Center working with "her seniors" until she retired last August at the age of 79. She was a member of the National NAACP, the American Red Cross Disaster Relief Team and the Daughters of the Elk. She was an active and devoted member of the Grace Bible Class Church in Passaic for over 50 years. She was very involved in the City of Passaic providing insight to local politicians on the specific needs of the local citizens, and rallying governmental leaders to support the city.

Sadie was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend to many. She was affectionately known as "Nanny" to her grandchildren and great grandchildren who loved her and looked forward every Sunday to wonderful Sunday dinners after church. Above all, Sadie believed in Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and was known to refer to Him as the "Master" of her life. Through her undying faith, she told everyone she came in contact with about the power in the name of Jesus. She possessed a quiet strength and willingness to help anyone. She generously gave to others in need, without question or explanation. Her life was a true testament to the following verses:
