Ann Jurely (Herron) McKinney was born on July 4, 1925 in Saluda, South Carolina to the late Richard and Annabelle (Washington) Herron.

At an early age Ann accepted Christ as her personal Savior and became a member of the Mt. Moses Methodist Church Saluda, SC. She was educated in the Saluda Public School system, graduating from the local high school.

In 1942, she married Charlie McKinney in Saluda, SC and they relocated to New Jersey, residing first in Garfield and then in Passaic, NJ. Five daughters were born of this union.

Ann, affectionately known as "Aunt Jurely" was employed for a short time at Harvey Knobby Shoe Company however, her main occupation was as a homemaker. Her pastime hobbies included crocheting and knitting, which she enjoyed immensely. She daily attended the Anna Shimkowitz Senior Center in Passaic, NJ.

In 1949, she united with the Calvary Baptist Church of Garfield under the pastorate of the late Rev. F. A. LaGarde and for many years served on the usher board. Aunt Jurely remained a faithful member serving under Calvary's current pastor, her beloved nephew, Pastor Calvin McKinney. On Sunday, April 29, 2012, she was recognized, along with twenty-five other faithful members as one of Calvary's "Seasoned Saints".

She was predeceased by her husband of fifty-two years, Charlie; two daughters, Mildred McKinney-Johnson and Joyce McKinney, and her brother, Willie Herron.

She departed this life on Sunday, June 17, 2012 in Paterson, NJ.
