### Reflections of Life

**Julia Cooper Harris** was born in Florence, SC on October 14, 1916. She was the daughter of Mrs. Charlotte Cooper, and the third oldest of the seven children, all of whom predeceased her. She received her elementary education in Florence, SC before moving to Paterson, NJ. In the early 1940's, Julia met and married the late Deacon Henry T. Harris, Sr. who died in 1962. She was the mother of Eugene Cooper, Douglas Harris, Helene Harris and the late Langston Harris and James Harris. She was also the loving step-mother of Rev. Thomas C. Harris and the late Madie Harris Scales, Henry O. and Lyrian Harris.

Julia was a faithful and loving wife to the late Deacon Henry T. Harris, who lost his sight at a young age. When he was no longer able to provide for his family, Julia traveled to nearby towns to do domestic work to help meet the family's need. She was an excellent cook, her apple and peach cobblers were second to none. In the early fall, Julia would can vegetables, fruits, make applesauce and several kinds of jellies to carry us through the winter months.

Mom, taught us how to sew, clean and to cook. Most of all she re-enforced the Word of God, that our Dad, taught us and admonished us to be faithful to the Lord, the source of all our blessings. Julia, was also the church pianist for awhile, and held several other positions in the church. She loved her family, and would beam with pride when the children or grandchildren would visit her.

In her later years, Mom lost the ability to walk, and also lost her hearing, but she was always mentally aware of her surroundings. She was kind hearted and would give you almost anything you'd ask of her. Mom wanted her food seasoned just right, and would not let anyone fool with her knees which gave her a lot of discomfort. All of the professional staff at Regency Gardens Nursing Home knew better than to try to get her to do something she didn't feel like doing, or you would get a sharp rebuke. Mom never lost her love of peppermint candy and chewing gum. We just loved to hear her tell us stories of the deep south during her childhood. We'll never forget one of her favorite sayings: "I'll foresee you."

Mom was predeceased by her husband, Deacon Henry T. Harris, sons, Langston, James and Henry Otis Harris, daughter, Madie Scales, brothers, Albert, Willie and Andrew Cooper, sisters, Daisy Taylor, Margaret Campbell and Odessa Mc Mannus.

On Wednesday, June 27th, Mom, entered her eternal rest at the Regency Gardens Nursing Home, in Wayne, NJ where she was a resident for the past two years.
