Reginald William Reed, affectionately known as "Reggie," was born on January 14, 1962 to William and Joeretha Reed in Savannah, Georgia. He suddenly made his transition on July 9, 2012.

As a young child, Reggie and his family relocated to Montclair, New Jersey. He attended the Montclair School System and graduated from Montclair High School in 1979. Immediately following graduation, Reggie was employed by West Essex Rehabilitation Center, currently known as Northwest Essex Community Healthcare Network, Inc., located at 83 Walnut Street, Montclair, NJ, as a Packaging Assembler until 1987. Afterwards, he was employed by Berliss Bearing Company as a Machine Operator until 1996 after the company closed down. He later became employed by Hospital Shower Curtain Company located in West Orange, NJ as a Material Handler from 2007 to 2009. In 2009, he returned to North Essex Community Healthcare Network, Inc., where he remained until his passing.

His colleagues and co-workers described Reggie as a diligent, hard-worker. In his early years, he loved clothes, music and dancing. He also enjoyed meeting "girls" and "making money!" Reggie was also an avid bike rider and a Mike Tyson fan! He even began training as a boxer and worked out regularly in a nearby gym in Paterson, NJ. Reggie was well-loved and will be missed tremendously.
